3. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION OF THE PREPARATION

The substances is classified as dangerous according to Directive 67/548/EC and its amendments.

High flammable

Irritating to skin.

4. FIRST AID MEASURES

General

In all cases of doubt, or when symptoms persist, seek medical attention. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

Inhalation

Remove to fresh air, keep patient warm and at rest, if breathing is irregular or stopped, administer artificial respiration. Give nothing by mouth. If unconscious place in recovery position and seek medical advice.

Eye Contact

Irrigate copiously with clean, fresh water for at least 10 minutes, holding the eyelids apart and seek medical advice.

Skin contact

Remove contaminated clothing. Wash skin thoroughly with soap and water or use recognized skin cleanser. Do NOT use solvents or thinners.

Ingestion

If accidentally swallowed, obtain immediate medical attention. Keep at rest. Do NOT induce vomiting.

5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

Fire will produce dense black smoke. Exposure to decomposition products may cause a health hazard. Appropriate breathing apparatus may be required. Cool closed containers exposed to fire with water. Do not allow run-off from fire fighting to enter drains or water

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courses.

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Exclude sources of ignition and ventilate the area. Avoid breathing vapors. Refer to protective measures listed in sections 7 and 8. Contain and collect spillage with non-combustible adsorbent materials, e.g. sand, earth, vermiculite, diatomaceous earth and place in container for disposal according to local regulations (see section 13). Do not allow to enter drains or watercourses. Clean preferably with a detergent; avoid use of solvents. If the product contaminates lakes, rivers or sewages, inform appropriate authorities in accordance with local regulations.

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Handling

Vapors are heavier than air and may spread along floors. Vapor may form explosive mixtures with air. Prevent the creation of flammable or explosive concentrations of vapor in air and avoid vapor concentration higher than the occupational exposure limits. Additionally, the product should only be used in areas from which all naked lights and others sources of ignition have been excluded. Electrical equipment should be protected to the appropriate standard.

Preparation may charge electrostatically

Always use earthing leads when transferring from one container another. Operators should wear anti-static footwear, and floors should be of the conducting type.

Container Storage

Keep container tightly closed. Isolate from sources of heat, sparks and open flame.

No sparking tools should be used.

Always keep in containers of same material as the original one.

Never use pressure to empty : Container is not a pressure vessel.

Avoid skin and eye contact. Avoid inhalation of vapor and spray mist.

Smoking, eating and drinking should be prohibited in application areas.

Skin Contacted

Comply with the health and safety at work laws.

When operators, Whether spraying or not, have to work inside the spray booth, ventilation is unlikely to be sufficient to control particulates and solvent vapor in all cases. In such circumstances they should wear a compressed aired respirator during the spraying process until such time as the particulates and solvent vapor concentration has fallen below the exposure limits.

Storage

Store in accordance with local rules and legislation. Observe label precautions .

Store between 5 and 30 °C in a dry, well ventilated place away from sources of heat and direct sunlight. Keep away from sources of ignition .Keep away from oxidizing agents, from strongly alkaline and strongly acid materials. No smoking . Prevent unauthorized access. Containers which are opened must be carefully resealed and kept upright to prevent leakage.

8. EXPOSURE CONTROLS / PERSONAL PROTECTION

Engineering Measures

: Provide adequate ventilation. Where reasonably practicable this should be achieved by use of local exhaust ventilation and good general extraction. If these are not sufficient to maintain concentration of particulates and solvent vapor below the OEL, suitable respiratory protection must be worn.

Personal Protection

Respiratory Protection : When workers are facing concentrations above the exposure limit, they must use appropriate certified respirators.

Hand Protection: For prolonged or repeated contact, wear suitable gloves. Barrier creams may help to protect the exposed areas of the skin, they should however not be applied once exposure has occurred.

Eye Protection : Use safety eyewear designed to protect against splash of liquids.

10. STABILITY AND REACTIVITY

Stable under recommended storage and handling conditions. (See section 7) When exposed to high temperatures may produce hazardous decomposition products such as carbon monoxide and dioxide smokes, oxides of nitrogen.

Keep away from oxidizing agents , Strongly alkaline and strongly acid materials in order to avoid exothermic reactions.

11. TOXICOLOGICAL INFORMATION

There are no data available on the preparation itself.

Exposure to component solvents vapors concentration in excess of the stated occupational exposure limit may result in adverse health effect such as mucous membrane and respiratory system irritation and adverse effect on kidney , liver and central nervous system .Symptoms and signs include headache ; dizziness , fatigue , muscular weakness ,Repeated or prolonged contact with the preparation may cause removal of natural fat from the skin resulting in non-allergic contact dermatitis and absorption through the skin. The liquid splashed in the eyes may cause irritation and reversible damage.
